

United States Army War College Seeks Ph.D. Professor Candidates

The U.S. Army War College (USAWC) is accepting applications from Army Competitive Category officers to fill positions as Professor, USAWC, in the Department of National Security and Strategy (DNSS). Military, international, diplomatic, history; international relations, or regional history/security (Americas, Africa, Europe; Asia) are the preferred fields of study for the candidate.

To enhance the academic credentials of military faculty member serving at the U.S. Army War College and to retain this expertise on the faculty, the USAWC selects Army Comp Competitive Category officers to obtain doctoral degrees. These officers will return to the USAWC and serve as Professor, USAWC, until mandatory retirement date.

Principal responsibilities for Professors, USAWC, include academic leadership, teaching, and scholarship. Specific duties include teaching core curriculum as well as graduate electives, faculty development, service on faculty committees and research. Dedication to excellence in teaching is an absolute requirement for this position.

The officer(s) selected for this position should have previous college-level or professional teaching experience. Candidates should hold a master's degree in a pertinent field, enabling them to complete Ph.D. course work within two (2) years. Applicants must have a strong commitment to the educational, military, physical, and ethical development of USAWC students. Candidates should possess an exemplary military record that includes success in leadership and staff positions at the strategic level.

Enrollment in or completion of Senior Service College is required.

Applicants should have no more than 22 years of service at the time of application.

Applicants who would enrich the diversity of the USAWC faculty are highly encouraged to apply.

Applications must include a statement of intent, pertinent biographical data and proof of ability to be accepted into an accredited Ph.D. program.

Department of National Security and Strategy (DNSS) will nominate one officer this year to start a Ph.D. program in 2020 to fill positions in 2022. Officers interested in applying for this position should contact the following by 1 NOV 19. Completed applications are due 15 NOV 19.
